


oound:

1) On 4/16/2016, the Libertarian Party of Minnesota (LPM) held their state convention in Maple Grove. At that convention, Jay Nygard was endorsed as a senate candidate in District 33. At that time, the Libertarian Party of Minnesota made Jay Nygard aware of the requirements of his candidacy and bylaws of the LPM.

2) On May 31st, Jay Nygard presented 504 valid signatures to the Hennepin County Elections division. At that time, as they do with all candidates, Jay Nygard was provided a packet of information regarding campaign finance laws and reporting requirements.




3) As part of the above package of information, Jay Nygard was provided information by the Minnesota Campaign Finance Board (MCFB), regarding requirements for financial disclosure. He also received, as all candidates did, directions to register their Statement of Economic Interests, which he completed.


4) Over the course of his candidacy, Jay Nygard has spent significant resources on his campaign. The following is a list of observed expenditures of his campaign and a reasonable estimate of each cost:



Conclusion/Charges:

From the evidence above, Jay Nygard was clearly in violation of State Statutes 10A.14, SubD 1 (#1 & #2) and State Statute 10A.105 by not registering a campaign committee with the MCFB and not reporting said expenses according to the required pre-primary and pre-general election timelines. Not only was Jay Nygard made aware of the reporting requirements, Mr Nygard knew of the reporting requirements exist due to the fact that he was a candidate for city council in 2000 and completed required financial reporting with the City of Orono.

As of 2/1/2017, Jay Nygard is 176 days in violation of reporting his campaign's pre-primary expenses, 93 days in violation of reporting his campaign's pre-general election expenses, and now in violation of year-end reporting. According to SS 10A.14 SubD 4, <u>each</u> report requirement carries a \$25 per day fine, to a maximum of \$1000.

It is the request of the complainant that the maximum fine be imposed for the flagrant and willful disregard of the Fair Campaign Practices Act. The complainant requests that Jay Nygard be fined at least \$3000 for his violations.
