Minnesota Statutes section 10A.022, subdivision 3, describes the procedures required for investigating complaints. A full description of the complaint process is available on the Board's website.

Briefly, the Board will notify you when it has received your complaint. The Board must send a copy of the complaint to the respondent. Complaints and investigations are confidential. Board members and staff cannot talk about an investigation except as required to carry out the investigation or to take action in the matter. After the Board issues a decision, the record of the investigation is public.

The law requires a complaint to go through two stages before the Board can begin an investigation: a prima facie determination and a probable cause decision. If the complaint does not pass one of the stages, it must be dismissed.

The Board has 10 business days after receiving your complaint to determine whether the complaint is sufficient to allege a prima facie violation of the campaign finance laws. If the Board determines that the complaint does allege a prima facie violation, the Board has 45 days to decide whether probable cause exists to believe a violation that warrants a formal investigation has occurred. Both you and the respondent have the right to be heard on the issue of probable cause before the Board makes this decision. The Board will notify you if the complaint moves to the probable cause stage.

If the Board determines that probable cause does not exist, the Board will dismiss the complaint. If the Board determines that probable cause exists, the Board will start an investigation. The Board will send you monthly updates regarding the status of the investigation. At the end of the investigation, the Board will offer you and the respondent the opportunity to be heard before the Board makes a final decision.

In most cases, the Board will issue findings, conclusions, and an order as its decision. For a spending or contribution limits violation, the Board can enter into a conciliation agreement with the respondent instead of issuing findings, conclusions, and an order. The Board's final decision will be sent to you and posted on the Board's website.

Under Minn. Stat. 10A.20, a political fund making independent expenditures in aggregate of more than \$200 in a local election must disclose certain information, including information on those expenditures, in a report filed no later than 42 days before the general election. For this reporting period, such a report must cover the period January 1 through September 20, 2022.

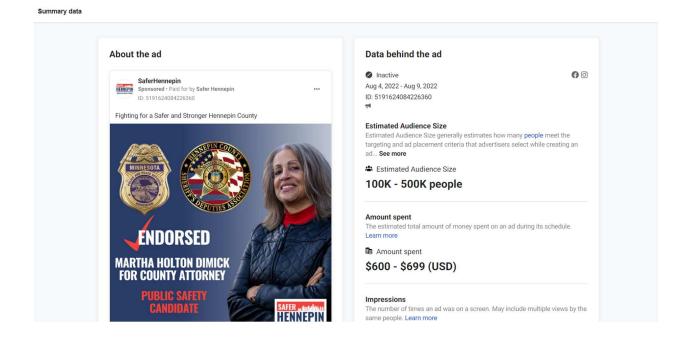
Safer Hennepin, through its treasurer Lawrence Wright, filed such a report September 27, 2022. No independent expenditures are accounted for in the required Schedule B3B. The report only lists general expenditures in Schedule B1.

However, Safer Hennepin made independent expenditures in aggregate of more than \$200 on behalf of Hennepin County Attorney candidate Martha Holton Dimick during the reporting period and failed to report those expenditures completely in its September 27, 2022 report.

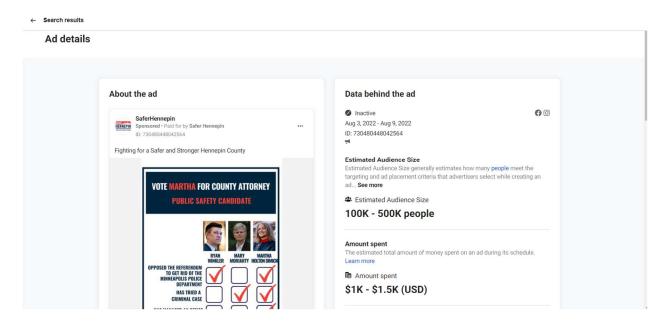
Evidence of Violation

When a Facebook Page purchases ads on the Facebook platform, the date that the ads ran and the approximate amount spent are documented in Facebook's public ad library. Safer Hennepin made expenditures in excess of \$200 during the reporting period on at least two occasions.

One ad ran August 4 through August 9 in favor of Holton Dimick and cost between \$600 to \$699 dollars.



A second ad ran August 3 through August 9 in favor of Holton Dimick and cost between \$1,000 and \$1,500 dollars.



The report appears to confuse general expenditures with independent expenditures. \$20,150 is disclosed as a general expenditure in Schedule B1. But Schedule B1 does not include any of the required information, including the date of expenditure, disclosure of the candidate spent in favor or against, the specific purpose of the expenditure, or the vendor (Facebook). The report also lists \$20,150 for independent expenditures on the Committee Transaction Summary page, indicating that the fund understood that such expenditures needed to be reported as independent expenditures and not as general expenditures. But the report does not include a Schedule B3B for independent expenditures in Hennepin County elections.

Because a Schedule B3B is not included, the report does not provide the information required by Minn. Stat. 10A.20, subd. (3). Thus, Safer Hennepin has violated Minn. Stat. 10A.20.
