2025

- February 5 First day for candidates to sign and file a public subsidy agreement for the special election cycle.
- February 6 First day for candidates to file to run for office. Candidates must file a statement of economic interest within 14 days after filing for office.
- February 11 Last day for candidates to file to run for office. Candidates must file by 5 p.m.
- February 11 Last day to raise contributions to qualify for public subsidy.
- February 11 Last day of transactions to be included in the pre-special primary report.
- February 12 Last day for candidates to sign and file a public subsidy agreement.
- February 12 Reporting of Large Contributions Pre-special primary
- through Contributions and loans from any one source totaling more than \$500 must be reported to the Board electronically or in person by the end of the next business day after receipt and also on subsequent reports of receipts and expenditures for the special election cycle. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. **Note:** Candidates who are unopposed at the special primary do not need to report large contributions and loans during this period.
- February 18 Last day to file an affidavit of contributions to qualify for public subsidy.
- February 18 **Pre-special primary report of receipts and expenditures due (if there is a special primary).** Period covered: January 1 through February 11, 2025.
- February 19 \$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the pre-special primary report.
- February 25 **SPECIAL PRIMARY** (if necessary)
- February 25 Last day of transactions to be included in the pre-special election report.

February 26 Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-special election

- through March 10 Contributions and loans from any one source totaling more than \$500 must be reported to the Board electronically or in person by the end of the next business day after receipt and also on subsequent reports of receipts and expenditures for the special election cycle. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. **Note:** Candidates who lost the special primary do not need to report large contributions and loans during this period.
- March 4 **Pre-special election report of receipts and expenditures due.** Period covered: January 1 through February 25, 2025.
- March 5 \$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the pre-special election report.
- March 11 SPECIAL ELECTION
- March 26 Public subsidy agreements expire for the special election cycle.
- March 27 New public subsidy agreements may be signed for 2025-2026 election cycle.
- March 31 Last day of transactions to be included in the special election cycle final report.
- April 7 **Special election cycle final report of receipts and expenditures due.** Period covered: January 1 through March 31, 2025. **Note:** Candidates will be required to file a 2025 year-end report in addition to the special election cycle final report unless the special election cycle final report is a termination report.
- April 8 \$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the special election cycle final report.
