January 13

November 17	First day for candidates to sign and file a public subsidy agreement for the special election cycle.
November 18	First day for candidates to file to run for office. Candidates must file a statement of economic interest within 14 days after filing for office.
November 25	Last day for candidates to file to run for office. Candidates must file by 5 p.m.
November 26	Last day for candidates to sign and file a public subsidy agreement.
December 1	Last day to raise contributions, and file affidavit of contributions, to qualify for public subsidy.
December 2	Last day of transactions to be included in the pre-special primary report.
December 3 through December 15	Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-special primary Contributions and loans from any one source totaling more than \$500 must be reported to the Board electronically or in person by the end of the next business day after receipt and also on subsequent reports of receipts and expenditures for the special election cycle. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. Note: Candidates who are unopposed at the special primary do not need to report large contributions and loans during this period.
December 9	Pre-special primary report of receipts and expenditures due (if there is a special primary for either major party). Period covered: November 17, 2025, through December 2, 2025.
December 10	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the pre-special primary report.
December 16	SPECIAL PRIMARY (if necessary)

Last day of transactions to be included in the pre-special election report.

January 14 through January 26	Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-special election Contributions and loans from any one source totaling more than \$500 must be reported to the Board electronically or in person by the end of the next business day after receipt and also on subsequent reports of receipts and expenditures for the special election cycle. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. Note: Candidates who lost the special primary do not need to report large contributions and loans during this period.
January 20	Pre-special election report of receipts and expenditures due. Period covered: November 17, 2025, through January 13, 2026.
January 21	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the pre-special election report.
January 27	SPECIAL ELECTION
February 11	Last day of transactions to be included in the special election cycle final report. Public subsidy agreements expire for the special election cycle.
February 12	New public subsidy agreements may be signed for regular 2025-2026 election cycle.
February 23	Special election cycle final report of receipts and expenditures due. Period covered: November 17, 2025, through February 11, 2026. Note: Candidates will be required to file a 2026 year-end report in addition to the special election cycle final report unless the special election cycle final report is a termination report.
February 24	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the special election cycle final report.
