

Senate District 6 Special Election Public Disclosure Calendar

March 25	First day for candidates to sign and file a public subsidy agreement for the special election cycle.
March 26	First day for candidates to file to run for office. Candidates must file a statement of economic interest within 14 days after filing for office.
April 1	Last day for candidates to file to run for office. Candidates must file by 5 p.m.
April 1	Last day to raise contributions to qualify for public subsidy.
April 1	Last day of transactions to be included in the pre-special primary report.
April 2	Last day for candidates to sign and file a public subsidy agreement.
April 2 through April 14	Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-special primary Contributions and loans from any one source totaling more than \$500 must be reported to the Board electronically or in person by the end of the next business day after receipt and also on subsequent reports of receipts and expenditures for the special election cycle. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. Note: Candidates who are unopposed at the special primary do not need to report large contributions and loans during this period.
April 7	Last day to file an affidavit of contributions to qualify for public subsidy.
April 8	Pre-special primary report of receipts and expenditures due (if there is a special primary). Period covered: January 1 through April 1, 2025.
April 9	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the pre-special primary report.
April 15	SPECIAL PRIMARY (if necessary)
April 15	Last day of transactions to be included in the pre-special election report.

April 16 through April 28	Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-special election Contributions and loans from any one source totaling more than \$500 must be reported to the Board electronically or in person by the end of the next business day after receipt and also on subsequent reports of receipts and expenditures for the special election cycle. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. Note: Candidates who lost the special primary do not need to report large contributions and loans during this period.
April 22	Pre-special election report of receipts and expenditures due. Period covered: January 1 through April 15, 2025. Note: Candidates who lost the special primary do not need to file this report.
April 23	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the pre-special election report.
April 29	SPECIAL ELECTION
May 14	Public subsidy agreements expire for the special election cycle.
May 15	New public subsidy agreements may be signed for 2023-2026 election cycle (for candidates who did not sign a public subsidy agreement prior to March 25, 2025).
May 20	Last day of transactions to be included in the special election cycle final report.
May 27	Special election cycle final report of receipts and expenditures due. Period covered: January 1 through May 20, 2025. Note: Candidates will be required to file a 2025 year-end report in addition to the special election cycle final report unless the special election cycle final report is a termination report.
May 28	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the special election cycle final report.
