

## **Senate District 60 Special Election Public Disclosure Calendar**

## 2024

December 30	First day for candidates to sign and file a public subsidy agreement.
December 31	Only day for candidates to file to run for office. Must file by 5 p.m.
December 31	Last day of transactions to be included in the pre-special primary report.

January 1 through January 13	Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-special primary  Contributions and loans from any one source totaling more than \$500 must be reported to the Board electronically or in person by the end of the next business day after receipt and also on subsequent reports of receipts and expenditures for the special election cycle. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. Note: Candidates who are unopposed at the special primary do not need to report large contributions during this period.
January 2	Last day for candidates to sign and file a public subsidy agreement.
January 6	Last day to raise contributions and file an affidavit of contributions to qualify for public subsidy.
January 7	Pre-special primary report of receipts and expenditures due. Period covered: January 1 through December 31, 2024. Note: This report is the same as the 2024 year-end report, and must be filed by all candidate committees registered with the Board regardless of whether there is a special primary. However, if there is no special primary, this report will not be due until January 31, 2025.
January 8	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the pre-special primary report.
January 14	SPECIAL PRIMARY (if necessary)
January 14	Statement of economic interest due. Period covered: November 2024.
January 14	Last day of transactions to be included in the pre-special election report.

January 15 through January 27	Reporting of Large Contributions – Pre-special election Contributions and loans from any one source totaling more than \$500 must be reported to the Board electronically or in person by the end of the next business day after receipt and also on subsequent reports of receipts and expenditures for the special election cycle. Failure to file the notice on time will result in a \$50 per day late filing fee. Note: Candidates who lost the special primary do not need to report large contributions during this period.
January 21	<b>Pre-special election report of receipts and expenditures due.</b> Period covered: January 1 through January 14, 2025.
January 22	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the pre-special election report.
January 28	SPECIAL ELECTION
January 30	\$5 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the statement of economic interest.
February 12	Public subsidy agreements expire for special election cycle.
February 13	New public subsidy agreements may be signed for 2025-2026 election cycle.
February 17	Last day of transactions to be included in the special election cycle final report.
February 24	<b>Special election cycle final report of receipts and expenditures due.</b> Period covered: January 1 through February 17, 2025. <b>Note:</b> Candidates will also be required to file a 2025 year-end report by February 2, 2026, unless the special election cycle final report is a termination report.
February 25	\$50 per day late filing fee begins for failure to file the special election cycle final report.
